As a demonstration of our Chapter's commitment to excellence and to our community's continued success in pursuit of strategic security, modernization, and readiness objectives, we're pleased to feature *ADM Michelle J. Howard (Ret.)* as this year's *keynote speaker*.

ADM Howard's 35-year career in the U.S. Navy was distinguished by her exceptional record as Commander of: a ship, an Expeditionary Strike Group, Task Force, and a Naval theater. In 1999 Michelle J. Howard became the first African American woman to command a ship in the U.S. Navy. In 2014, she was the first woman to become a four-star Admiral in the U.S. Navy and the first woman to be appointed to the position of Vice Chief of Naval Operations

(VCNO). She is the first African American woman to reach the rank of three-star and four stars in the Armed Forces.

Her last command was from 2016 to 2017 as U.S. Naval Forces Europe and Africa (NAVEUR-NAVAF). She simultaneously led NATO's Allied Joint Force Command Naples with oversight of missions from the Western Balkans to Iraq. Operations in her career include NATO peacekeeping, West African Training Cruise,

Indonesia Tsunami Relief operations, and the rescue of Maersk Alabama from Somali Pirates. Michelle is a Desert Storm and Operation Iraqi Freedom veteran.

She is currently one of 13 members of the IBM board of directors. She also served on the Board of Visitors for the U.S. Naval Academy from 2022 to 2024, and on an advisory panel to the US Institute of Peace. Consistent with the 2024 inaugural Vice Admiral Samuel L. Gravely Jr. Trailblazer Awards, the **2025 ADM Michelle J. Howard Senior Leader Award** recognizes the community's senior-most leaders from active duty (AD) military, GS civilian, industry, and academia. To qualify, awardees' careers must be distinguished by—

- Current rank not less than O-6 (AD military).
- Current grade not less than GS-15 (GS civilians).
- More than 25 years of continual service to U.S. DoD organizations.
- Extensive Joint operations, where applicable.
- Significant contributions to U.S. National Security, U.S. National Defense, and/or domestic technological comparative advantages.

This year's technical panels (**CEU Approved**) will focus on four key dimensions of deploying Warfighter- and Warfighting-enabling AI.

DAY 2 UNCLASSIFIED TRACK: Featuring a Keynote address from Mr. John W. R. Pope III, Executive Director, NAVWAR.

- Appointed SES in January 2016 and began his government career in 1983.
- Responsible for approximately 12,000 civilian and military personnel and an annual budget of more than \$9 Billion, focused on the acquisition, delivery and sustainment of major command, control, communications, computers, intelligence, surveillance, reconnaissance, enterprise information, and space systems for the Department of the Navy.
- Mr. Pope's tours within NAVWAR include Joint Task Group Manager, Afloat Installations Manager and Advanced Tactical Data Link Systems Engineer in the Tactical Data Link Programs Office (PMW 159). In December 2000, Mr. Pope was selected as the Deputy Program Manager for the Navy Satellite Communications Program Office (PMW 176). After serving as the fifth Commanding Officer of Naval Information Warfare Center Atlantic, Charleston, S.C., he returned to PEO C4lwhere he served as the Major Program Manager of the Communications Program Office (PMW 170) and the Principal

Deputy Program Executive Officer. As a plank owner of NAVWAR's Fleet Readiness Directorate, Mr. Pope served as the Fleet Support Program Manager. After 29 years of active duty, Mr. Pope began his civilian career in 2012 as the Director for the Data Center and Application program within NAVWAR.

- Defense Acquisition Corps, certified Level III in Acquisition Program Management.
- BS Electrical Engineering, University of Pennsylvania.
- MS Electrical Engineering, NPS.
- Received Navy commission via the University of Pennsylvania NROTC in 1983.
- Active duty awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit with Gold Star in lieu of fourth award, Meritorious Service Medal with Gold Star in lieu of third award, Navy Commendation Medal with Gold Star in lieu of second award, Navy Unit Commendation, and the Sea Service Deployment Ribbon. Mr. Pope received the Department of the Navy Superior Civilian Service Award in June 2020.

Following Mr. Pope's remarks, **Command Master Petty Officer Chief Jeanette M. Hafer, NAVWAR**, will provide an address underscoring the operational conditions of today's afloat warfighter.

- Jeanette M. Hafer hails from Chicago, Illinois. In March 1998, she reported for active duty at Recruit Training Command in Great Lakes Illinois. After completing boot camp, Master Chief Hafer reported to Radioman 'A' School at Naval Technical Training Center in Great Lakes, Illinois.
- She has served in multiple sea and shore assignments, including Commander Naval Forces Korea in Seoul, Korea, Center for Information Dominance (CID) in Norfolk, Virginia, USS EMORY S LAND (AS-39) in La Madellena, Italy, Naval Special Warfare Development Group (NSWDG) at Damneck, Virginia, EODMU FIVE located on Santa Rita, Guam, Expeditionary Strike Group Seven located on Okinawa, Japan as the Senior Enlisted Leader and Navy Personnel Command in Millington, Tennessee.

- She has served as the Command Master Chief onboard USS ARLEIGH BURKE (DDG 51), Norfolk VA. Her second CMDCM tour was as a CMDCM/COB Course Facilitator at the Naval Leadership and Ethics Center, Newport RI. She then reported to COMDESRON 23, San Diego CA as their first Command Master Chief. In November of 2024 she reported to NAVWARSYSCOM, San Diego CA as their Command Master Chief.
- CMDCM Hafer holds a Master's Degree in Workforce Education and Development from Southern Illinois University in Carbondale, IL. She is a graduate of the National Defense University Keystone Course, CMC/COB (Course 181) and the Senior Enlisted Academy (Class 162). Her decorations
